



Junior Fair Book - Goats

I HERD IT AT THE FAIR

Junior Dairy Goat – Division G

Superintendent– Eric McCullough

RULES:

1. All Junior Division rules apply
2. Bucks over 6 months of age will be shown on an in-an-out basis on show day. They will not be stalled on the Fairgrounds.
3. A Scrapie Flock of Origin Tag will be required at weigh-in and at Fair check in for sexually intact breeding goats that do not have a registration tattoo and all breeding goats, regardless of age, that are or have been commingled with sheep and do not have a registration tattoo.
4. All Scrapie tags and Montrose County Fair tags must be present and remain intact on the animal throughout the entire Fair.
5. All 4-H/FFA dairy goats need to be dehorned or disbudded and scurs or regrowth may not exceed 1 inch.
6. In Goat barn participants must provide a clip on all pens to secure gates.
7. Exhibitors are required to do their own cleaning, feeding and milking. **Parents may coach the kids but will not do the exhibitor's daily chores.**
8. All Dairy exhibitors will wear white pants and white shirts.
9. All tattoos/ear tags will be noted on all entry forms i.e. R-Ear, L-ear...

1. Buck - 2 years and under 3

3. Buck - 5 years and over

CROSS/UTILITY ALL OTHER BREEDS

Junior Market and Meat Type Goat – Division H

RULES:

1. All Junior Division rules apply.
2. Bucks over 6 months of age will be shown on an in-an-out basis on show day. They will not be stalled on the Fairgrounds.
3. Weight limit for Market goats is 60 pounds to 110 pounds.
4. Market Goats must be carrying all milk teeth in normal positions. Goats showing either or both of the first pair of permanent incisors will be disqualified. Every goat will be checked prior to entering scales. If there is a question, an expert Goat person will be called in to verify, their decision is final.
5. A Scrapie Flock of Origin Tag will be required at weigh-in and at Fair check in for sexually intact breeding goats that do not have a registration tattoo, all breeding goats, regardless of age, that are or have been commingled with sheep and do not have a registration tattoo and market goats consigned to the Junior Livestock Sale. Scrapie tags must be installed prior to the initial weigh and tag-in.
6. All Scrapie tags and Montrose County Fair tags must be present, remain intact, and match on the animal, from tag-in, throughout the entire Fair.
7. All 4-H/FFA Market Goat horns must have blunt tips no smaller than dime sized.
8. In Goat barn, participants must provide a clip on all pens to secure gates.
9. Exhibitors are required to do their own cleaning, feeding and milking. Parents may coach the kids but will not do the exhibitor's daily chores.
10. Market Goats ONLY can be lifted and set/braced. However, animals feet will not remain off the show ring floor after bracing. Judges and superintendents will have discretion to enforce disqualification.
11. All tattoos/ear tags will be noted on all entry forms i.e. R-Ear, L-ear.

WETHER DAM

Section 5

1. An exhibitor may show three (3) wether dams
2. No extra or alternate goats (goats not entered in the wether dam show) will be allowed on grounds.

3. Wether dams will need to be checked in at the initial Sheep/Goat weigh-in to record Scrapie Tags for proof of ownership.
4. Junior wether dams must be younger than 12 months old.
5. All junior wether dams must be carrying temporary incisors (milk teeth) at time of show with no permanent incisors in view. Goats with teeth that have been tampered with, will be disqualified at the discretion of show officials.
6. Yearling dows cannot be older than 24 months old and should have their first set of permanent incisors.
7. Goats shown in the wether dam show may not be shown in the Market Goat Show and vice versa.
